Regulation vs Innovation: Artificial Intelligence and the New Model of European Development

Poznań Institute for Western Affairs, November 6th, 2024

The European Union faces a major challenge in the global race for dominance in artificial intelligence (AI). The race unfolds against a backdrop of international instability and a rise in high-risk economic dependencies. Although the European Union lags behind the U.S. and China in some fields of technology, it is actively shaping its legal framework to regulate AI development. The European AI Act, which forms the world's first fully comprehensive body of laws to govern this technology, aims to balance risk mitigation and innovation friendliness.

The conference will explore Europe's ability to create its own development model that prioritizes safe, transparent, and human-centered AI, while strengthening its technological sovereignty. Discussions will focus on strategies to uphold high ethical standards, and promote data protection, and intellectual property rights while avoiding overregulation that could hamper business development. We will also explore the opportunities for collaboration among European states, especially Poland and Germany, by comparing their diverse approaches to AI development.

- Can Al drive a new European development model?
- Will the EU's AI Act bring about another "Brussels effect", setting international standards for AI regulation?
- What opportunities, challenges, and risks does AI bring to politics, society, the economy, and science?
- What distinguishes the Polish and German approach to AI development?
- How can European nations collaborate to ensure that AI is both safe and competitive?

Join us, along with Europe's foremost experts, to discuss these critical questions and examine the future role of artificial intelligence in Europe.
